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Introduction

General

The Martin® Durt DozerTM Plow protects pulleys from material carryback on single-direction conveyor belts. Hung from brackets at a 45° angle across the belt, the Martin® Durt DozerTM Plow rides on the conveyor belt and is spring tensioned to provide efficient cleaning. The Durt DozerTM Plow is designed so that its metal frame will not contact the belt when the cleaning edge is worn away. When one side of the blade is worn, it can be flipped over to provide additional cleaning. A safety cable prevents the plow from being carried into the pulleys should its mounting brackets come loose.

The Martin® Durt DozerTM Plow is equipped with a replaceable high-density polyethylene cleaning blade and is available in sizes to fit belts from 18 to 96 in. (400 to 2400 mm) wide.

Materials required

Only standard hand tools are required to install and service this equipment.

Before Installing Plow

- 1. Inspect shipping box for damage. Report damage to delivery service. Fill out damage report and return to Martin Engineering.
- 2. Remove plow from shipping box. Equipment in box should include the following:
 - Martin® Durt DozerTM Plow Assembly.
 - Two Conveyor Products Warning Labels, P/N 23395.
 - Two Flying Objects Warning Labels, P/N 38227.
 - Two Martin[®] Durt DozerTM Plow Tensioning Labels, P/N 33738.
 - · Warranty card.
 - · Damage report.
- 3. If anything is missing or damaged, contact Martin Engineering or representative. Fill out warranty card and return to Martin Engineering.



AWARNING

Before installing equipment, turn off and lock out/tag out energy source to conveyor and conveyor accessories.

4. Turn off and lock out/tag out energy source according to ANSI standards (see "References").



▲WARNING

If equipment will be installed in an enclosed area, gas level or dust content must be tested before using a cutting torch or welding. Using a cutting torch or welding in an area with gas or dust may cause an explosion.

5. If using a cutting torch or welding, test atmosphere for gas level or dust content. Cover conveyor belt with fire retardant cover.

IMPORTANT

Read entire section before beginning work.

To install the Martin[®] Durt DozerTM Plow, follow the procedures corresponding to the following steps:

- 1. Install mount brackets on stringers.
- 2. Install plow assembly onto mount brackets.
- 3. Tension blade against belt.
- 4. Install restraining cable.

Installing mount brackets




Figure 1. Locating Plow on Belt

1. Locate plow on return side of conveyor belt before tail pulley where belt is taut or supported by idler. (See Figure 1.)

Left side is determined by standing at tail pulley and looking toward head pulley.

- 2. Locate left side mount bracket as follows:




Figure 2. Locating Mount Brackets on Stringers

 - a. See Figure 2. Starting from face of tail pulley, measure distance shown under "Locate Left Bracket" in Table I, and mark location on stringer on left side of belt.




Figure 3. Installing Martin® Durt DozerTM Plow Assembly

 - b. Center mount bracket (A, Figure 3) on mark. Using bracket as template, mark location of mounting holes on stringer with bottom of bracket 1-1/2 in. (38 mm) above belt surface.
- 3. Locate right side mount bracket as follows:
 - a. See Figure 2. Starting from left side mounting hole marks, measure toward tail pulley distance shown under "Locate Right Bracket" in Table I. Mark location on left side stringer.

- b. Mark same location on right side stringer, directly across from mark on left side stringer. (This should be at 45° angle from left side mounting hole marks.)
- c. Center mount bracket on mark. Using bracket as template, mark location of mounting holes on right side stringer with bottom of bracket 1-1/2 in. (38 mm) above belt surface.
- 4. Bolt or weld mount brackets to stringers as follows:
 - a. If bolting, drill or cut two 11/16-in. holes in each stringer where marked. Remove burrs and sharp edges. Apply thread sealing compound to four jam nuts (B). Install each mount bracket with two hex head cap screws (C), four flat washers (D), and two jam nuts.
 - b. If welding, position mount brackets over marks on stringers. Weld mount brackets to stringers, making continuous weld around entire mount bracket.

Installing plow onto mount brackets

- 1. Loosen four screws (E, Figure 3) and nuts (F) attaching blade (G) and frame (H) to end brackets (J and K).
- 2. Slide end brackets over threaded rods on mount brackets (A), with shorter end bracket (J) on left side mount bracket and longer end bracket (K) on right side mount bracket. Make sure concave side of blade is facing head pulley.
- 3. Slide frame on end brackets to center blade on belt. When centered, tighten screws (E) and jam nuts (F) to secure blade in place. Make sure blade is resting on belt surface.

Tensioning blade against belt

- 1. Drop two springs (L, Figure 3) onto threaded rods on mount brackets (A). Make sure springs rest on bottom weldment of mount brackets.
- 2. Install four flat washers (M) and two nuts (N) onto threaded rods. Make sure a flat washer rests on top of each spring.
- 3. Turn nuts until they hold flat washers firmly against springs, but without compressing springs.
- 4. Turn nuts further according to Table I.

ACAUTION

Installing restraining cable

Restraining cable must be installed to prevent plow from being carried into pulley if mount brackets should fail. Failure to do so could severely damage plow, pulley, and belt.




Figure 4. Installing Restraining Cable

1. Loop one end of hanger cable (A, Figure 4) through hanger c-clamp (B) and secure with cable clip (C).

ACAUTION

Do not install restraining cable on stringer that is between plow and tail pulley.

- 2. Apply thread sealing compound to threads of square head set screw (D). Secure hanger c-clamp to same stringer that mount bracket is installed on, or another stringer that is between plow and head pulley. Tighten square head set screw.
- 3. Loop loose end of hanger cable through hole in frame (E) and secure with cable clip. Leave no more than 2 in. (51 mm) of slack in cable.

After Installing Plow

IMPORTANT

Read entire section before beginning work.

Thoroughly wipe outside chute walls clean above Martin® Durt DozerTM
Plow on both sides of chute. Place Conveyor Products Warning Labels
(P/N 23395), Flying Objects Warning Labels (P/N 38227), and Martin®
Durt DozerTM Plow Tensioning Labels (P/N 33738) on chute walls visible to plow operator.



AWARNING

Failure to remove tools from installation area and conveyor belt before turning on energy source can cause serious injury to personnel and damage to belt.

2. Remove all tools and fire retardant cover from installation area and conveyor belt.



A DANGER

Do not touch or go near conveyor belt or conveyor accessories when conveyor belt is running. Body or clothing can get caught and pull body into conveyor belt, causing severe injury or death.

3. Turn on conveyor belt.



AWARNING

Before adjusting tail protection plow, turn off and lock out/tag out energy source to conveyor belt and conveyor accessories.

- 4. After 1 hour of operation, turn off and lock out/tag out energy source according to ANSI standards (see "References").
- 5. Make sure all fasteners are tight. Tighten if necessary.
- 6. Inspect plow blade for wear. (A small amount of "break-in" wear may be found. This will stop once blade wears to conveyor belt contour.)
- 7. Make sure plow is pushing material off edge of belt efficiently, leaving minimal material on belt.
- 8. If wear, material buildup, or some other problem exists, see "Troubleshooting/Installation Checklist."
- 9. Repeat steps 2 and 3.


Read entire section before beginning work.



AWARNING

Before servicing tail protection plow, turn off and lock out/tag out energy source to conveyor belt and conveyor accessories.

- 1. Turn off and lock out/tag out energy source according to ANSI standards (see "References").
- 2. Make sure all fasteners are tight. Tighten if necessary.
- 3. Make sure blade is still properly tensioned against belt. If blade is not cleaning effectively, follow procedure under "Tensioning blade against belt."
- 4. Check blade for wear. If blade no longer contacts belt at full tension and end brackets are resting on mount brackets, do the following:
 - a. Remove screws (E, Figure 3), jam nuts (F), and flat washers (P) attaching blade and frame (H) to end brackets (J and K).
 - b. If other side of blade is not worn, flip blade over. If both sides of blade are worn, install a new blade. Make sure concave side of blade faces head pulley.
 - c. Apply thread sealing compound to jam nuts. Install blade onto frame and end brackets with screws, nuts, and flat washers, but do not tighten.
 - d. Slide frame on end brackets to center blade on belt. When centered, tighten screws and nuts to secure blade in place. Make sure blade is resting on belt surface.
 - e. Follow procedure under "Tensioning blade against belt."
- 5. Check restraining cable for wear. Make sure hanger c-clamp is securely attached to stringer.
- 6. Wipe warning labels clean. If labels are not readable, contact Martin Engineering or representative for replacements.

7. Remove all tools from maintenance area.

8. Start conveyor belt.

Troubleshooting/Installation Checklist

Troubleshooting

If you are experiencing problems with tail protection plow, see below:

Symptom	Corrective Action	
Material buildup on blade	Blade is not installed at 45° angle. Check angle and re-install if necessary.	
High blade wear rate.	Tension is set too high. Reduce tension.	
Insufficient cleaning and carryback.	Tension is set too low or too high. Increase or decrease tension. Check blades for excessive wear and flip over or replace if necessary.


If after taking corrective actions suggested under "Troubleshooting" you are still experiencing problems, check for the following:

Installation Checklist

- Tail protection plow is installed where belt is taut or supported by idler.
- Tail protection plow is installed at 45° angle across belt.
- Ends of frame are equal distance from belt.
- Blade is centered on belt.
- Concave side of blade is facing head pulley.




Figure 7. Conveyor Products Warning Label, 23395
